THE DECLARATION OF THE RIGHTS OF MAN (1789), THE TEN COMMANDMENTS, AND THE ETHICS OF PSYCHOANALYSIS

This seminar will examine the historical development of the notion of law starting from the Greek elaboration of the unwritten law (*phusis*) to the formal statement of the *Declaration of the Rights of Man* in 1789. Exploring the opposition between the biblical notion of the "duties" of man to the idea of man's "rights," this seminar will examine the position of analytical ethics on "rights" vs. "duties."

THE *TIMES* OF THE SUBJECT AND THE PLACE OF THE PARENTS IN CHILD ANALYSIS
