Or, que veut dire l'analyse du transfert? Si elle veut dire quelque chose, elle ne peut être que ceci: l'élimination de ce sujet supposé-savoir. Il n'y a pas pour l'analyse, il n'y a pas, bien moins encore pour l'analyste, nulle part—et là est la nouveauté—de sujet supposé-savoir. Il n'y a que ce qui résiste à l'opération du savoir faisant le sujet, à savoir ce residu qu'on peut appeler la verité.

Mais justement, c'est là que peut surgir la question de Ponce-Pilate: qu'est-ce que la vérité? Qu'est-ce que la vérité est proprement la question que je pose, et pour introduire ce qu'il en est de l'acte proprement psychanalytique.

So, what does analysis of the transference mean? If it means anything, it can only be this: the elimination of the subject supposed to know. For analysis, even less for the analyst—and that is what is new—the subject supposed to know is nowhere to be found. There is nothing except this that resists the operation of knowledge producing the subject, that is, this residue that one could call the truth.

And precisely, it is here that Pontius Pilate's question may arise: what is the truth? What is the truth is exactly the question I am asking, and I raise it to introduce that which precisely constitutes the analytical act.

The notion of the *formation of the analyst* cannot be reduced to the notion of *training.* "Training" connotes an apprenticeship in knowledge, conceived of as a set of procedures to develop a practical expertise. In the field of psychoanalysis, the "know how" obtained from such training elicits the idea of an adherence to conformity and a conforming of behavior. In contrast, the notion of "formation," from the Latin *formare,* means to shape, to give form; as Webster's Collegiate Dictionary indicates, "formation" is the *act of creating or causing to exist.* It also implies the manner in which something is structured. These definitions are consistent with the analytical act, which necessarily implies a subjective transformation, a new creation. A body of knowledge does not produce an analyst.
